

# Personal DailyWalk

Last week we spent the week praying through the Sermon on the Mount. This week, let's pray through the blessings and woes from Luke 6



## February 26 – March 4, 2018

**Monday: Luke 6:20-21** Can you find the blessing in what the world would see as a negative? Pray for God to show you His blessings in your struggles.

**Tuesday: Luke 6:22-23** Do you wear Jesus not only in your heart but also on your chest for all the world to see? Pray for God to show you His blessings for boldly following Jesus into this world.

**Wednesday: Luke 6:24-25** Or do you find yourself on the **woe** spectrum? You have been blessed with more than you need, yet you haven't found a way to bless others with your abundance. Pray for God to strengthen your heart to be a blessing to others through the blessings you have received.

**Thursday: Luke 6:26** Are you a **yes** person to the world instead of a **yes** person to God? Do you tell others what they want to hear, instead of God's truth? Pray for God to strengthen you so that you may share your faith story with others and that they may have an opportunity to be blessed by the same loving and merciful savior.

**Friday: Luke 6:27-31** There you go again Jesus, turning the world upside down. Asking us to do the exact opposite of what our worldly body naturally does. Pray in these verses today, asking God to show you where you should have turned the other cheek, when you should have given instead of kept, how you treat others not in the same manner you wish to be treated. Have God show you your own hypocrisy, and then fall to your knees as asking for forgiveness.

**Saturday: Luke 6:32-36** There is a fine line between servanthood and servitude, and that line is found in your heart. Do you love God? Do you see all people as God's children whom He loves and cares about immensely? Are you a servant of God? If you answered yes to all three questions, where does that lead you when you read these verses? Pray for the God of love to show you how to love ALL His people with the love that comes from Him.

**Sunday: John 2:13-22** Am I the only one who struggles with seeing Jesus so angry? It just seems so 'not my sweet Jesus.' This leads me to ponder the question of 'what does this story tell me about the character of God.' Pray to God that you keep first things first in your life.
