March 12-18, 2018



Monday: Numbers 27:12-23 Even Moses mentored and modeled leadership so that others may come up behind him. Moses wasn't perfect, yet he could still mentor and equip others. Even through his imperfections. Who are you mentoring, equipping to leadership, bringing up beside you? Pray for God to show you who you shall mentor into leadership.

Tuesday: 1 Corinthians 10:23-33 I have really tried to keep verse 23 in the forefront of my mind for the last year... *"All things are lawful," but not all things are beneficial.* That really speaks volumes to me. In food, in exercise, in the way you interact with others, in the way you bring others up. Take some time outside yourself today and really look at how you are living the day. Are your actions beneficial to yourself and others? Are your interactions life-giving to those around you? Pray that your life brings Glory to God.

Wednesday: Psalm 40 Pray in this Psalm today, pleading with God to help you respond to his salvation, not through superficially living into this world, but with sacrificially living into His will.

Thursday: 2 Corinthians 13 What do you take away from Paul's warning? During self-examination, what do you see in yourself that needs to be looked at? After self-examination, can you still feel the connection to *'The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.'*

Friday: Genesis 12:1-9 Has God called you to do something greater than you have ever thought possible? I would venture to say that we don't jump at the first call from God; that He has to continue to call us to this greater place multiple times before we actually respond with 'here I am Lord; send me'. Pray in thanksgiving for our tenacious God who doesn't leave us where we are comfortable, but calls us to greater adventures.

Saturday: Matthew 28:16-20 Have you placed yourself in the 'Go therefore...'? Do you feel emboldened to share the Good News to those around you? Pray in thanksgiving for God's presence and strength so that you may boldly share His Good News.

Sunday: John 12:20-36 As we inch closer to Palm Sunday and Holy Week, are you finding your soul troubled too? We know what is coming. Do you yearly grieve the injustice, yet give praise and thanksgiving for the sacrifice? Can you daily live into the tension between grief and praise? Pray in the tension between grief and praise, thanking God for the suffering, death, and resurrection of our Savior Christ, and asking what in our life needs to die so that we may be resurrected in Christ. (Side question – did the Greeks get to meet with Jesus?)
